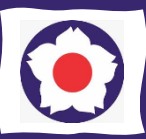

Exceptions

(to) be
was/were

I was happy.
Were you happy? - I was not happy. (wasn't)

(to) can
could

I could help you.
Could you help me? - I could not help you.
(couldn't)

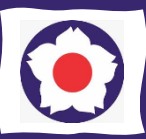
